Response:

University of North Bengal is situated in the Northern part of the state of West Bengal, and has a long tradition of discharging its responsibilities to educational aspirants beyond the campus, living mostly in the foothills of Himalaya. The University has been unfolding a robust system of extension programmes /activities in its curricula/programmes since its foundation. Many initiatives in this regard are listed below:

Concept Note and Brief report

Two-Days Intensive Awareness Outreach Extension Programme on Disaster Management organized by Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension, University of North Bengal in collaboration with IQAC, Rajganj College, Jalpaiguri. It was held during 15th March, 2022 to 16th March, 2022 at Rajganj, Jalpaiguri.

The inaugural session was started by Dr. Sidhartha Sankar Laha, Associate Professor & Programme Coordinatore, Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of North Bengal. He acknowledged delegates and participants for joining the programme and mentioned that in the 21st Century, we are living in multi hazard times.

The programme started with the inaugural speech by Prof. Monotosh Bose, Head, Associate Professor, Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension, University of North Bengal; he extended a warm welcome to the dignitaries, the teaching faculties and participants. Prof. Monotosh Bose talked about Honourable Prime Minister's 10 point Agenda on Disaster Risk Reduction. He stated that advancement of science and other body of knowledge has reduced the disaster damages. He also mentioned that this programme will let you know about different disasters and strategies to manage them. It was followed by the auspicious ritual of lightning the lamp by the dignitaries.

The programme was presided by a special guest Shri Pankaj Konar, BDO, Rajganj Development Block. He was invited to unfold the theme and give a brief overview about the topic. He made everyone clear with the concept disaster rehabilitation which included subtopics like reconstruction, challenges, aims, planning, short term and long term rehabilitation.

Dr. Haraprasad Mishra, Principal, Rajganj College; highlighted the significance of the programme. He quoted the example of how people are dying in hospitals due to improper arrangement and mentioned that it is also a type of disaster. He specifically mentioned that in order to control the disaster our infrastructure should be strong enough.

First day technical session was presented by Shri Subrata Bhattacharya, Former DDMO; He discussed about utilization of natural resources in such a way so as not to harm our mother earth. He also mentioned different types of Hazards: - Natural and Man made disaster, Violence and Environmental Degradation. He discussed various terminologies used in understanding of Disasters viz Prevention, Mitigation, Preparedness, Response, Rehabilitation, Reconstruction etc. and made clear definitions with live examples.

The following a very sensitive yet important topic First Aid was taken by Mr. Rafikul Islam, First Aid Faculty, Jalpaiguri. In which he elaborated the definition and necessities of first aid by showing interesting pictures and eye catching videos. He stated that the decision to act appropriately with first aid can mean the difference between life and death. He told the all participants that having a kit in your home, your car, and at your place of work is essential to stay prepared. He showed a list of common items found in a first aid kit.

Second day technical session was presented by Mrs. Jayashree Dhar, SDDMO; She discussed what actually "Disaster Risk Reduction" is ? How leverage technology is enhancing the efficiency of DRR efforts ? and what NITI Aayog has explained about the water crisis in India ? She shed light on how efficient planning is needed for keeping a check on climate change. She enlightened on how technology can be help for water conservation and wet line mapping can be used for remote areas as it is cost efficient.

In association with Jalpaiguri Fire Station Division exhibition on Disaster Management Equipment, various tools and equipment crucial for emergency response were displayed and the trainee were briefed about various fire safety equipment and the way to operate them during emergency situations. In addition to this, brief mock drills were organized by Jalpaiguri Fire brigade team.

Dr. Haraprasad Mishra, Principal, Rajganj College; concluded the programme and expressed his satisfaction over successful completion. He mentioned a very important aspect of Disaster Risk Management. He further highlighted that Disasters are no longer to be considered as incidences to be managed through emergency response services.

The Two-Days Intensive Awareness Outreach Extension Programme on Disaster Management Organized by Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension, University of North Bengal in collaboration with IQAC, Rajganj College, Jalpaiguri was divided into two days. Both days were divided into two phases e.g. 1st Phase (10.00 AM to 1.00 PM) and 2nd Phase (2.00 PM to 4.00 PM). The entire programme came to an end on the 2nd day at 4.00 pm with vote of thanks was made by Dr. Sidhartha Sankar Laha, Associate Professor and Course Coordinator, DLLE, NBU; followed by distribution of certificates. PROPOSAL FOR ORGANIZING INTENSIVE AWARENESS OUTREACH EXTENSION PROGRAMMES ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT DURING THE YEAR 2021-2022

The One Month Certificate course on Health & Nutrition of Children was organized by Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE), University of North Bengal, Darjeeling, West Bengal in association with Department of Community Medicine, North Bengal College & Hospital, Darjeeling, West Bengal. Minerals of biological importance- namely Iron, Calcium, Iodine: Nutrients- are organic and inorganic complexes contained in food. Micronutrients are vitamins and minerals required in small amounts which may vary from a fraction of a milligram to several grams. More than 50 chemical elements are found in human body, which are required for growth, repair, and regulation of vital body functions.

CALCIUM (Ca)- Major mineral element of the body. 1.5-2 % of the body weight of an adult- 1200 g of Ca of which >98% is found in the bones. Developing foetus requires about 30 g of calcium. There is a dynamic equilibrium between the calcium in the blood and that in the skeleton maintained by the interaction of vitamin d, parathyroid hormone.

IRON- The adult human body contains between 3-4 g of iron, of which about 60-70 % is present in the blood (Hb iron) as circulating iron, Rest (1 -1.5 g) as storage iron.

IODINE is required for the synthesis of the thyroid hormones. Iodine is essential in minute amounts for normal growth development and well-being. The adult human body contains about 50 mg of iodine, and the blood level is about 8- $12 \mu g/dl$

The main functions of these minerals in the human body, sources of these minerals from food, absorption-inhibitors and promoters of absorption of these in the human body, recommended dietary allowances for Indians in different physiological states, main deficiency disorders were discussed interactively with

preventive measures.

Food and health: At the end of the session the learner would be able to understand the concept of Food and its effect on health-Food borne diseases, Food toxicants, Food hygiene, Food additives, fortification, adulteration. Food is a potential source of infection and is liable to contamination by microorganisms, at any point during its journey from the producer to the consumer. Food hygiene implies hygiene in the production, handling, distribution and serving of all types of food to prevent food poisoning and other food-borne illnesses. Various food toxicants were discussed Neurolathyrism, Aflatoxins, Ergot, Epidemic dropsy, Endemic ascites, Fusarium toxins. Milk hygiene, meat hygiene, fish hygiene, sanitation of eating places was discussed.

Nutrition related public health problems: At the end of the session the learner would be able to understand the extent and effect of nutrition related public health problems like, nutritional anaemia, Vitamin A Deficiency, Iodine Deficiency Disorder, endemic fluorosis, the related preventive measures under various national programmes. Social aspects of nutrition and Nutritional factors in childhood obesity were also discussed.

MCH programs in India: At the end of the session the learner would be able to understand the backdrop of Maternal and Child Health programs in India, what is RMNCH+A strategy? - goals, objectives, high impact interventions- 5x5 matrix of RMNCH+A. Organizing of maternal health services- Levels of service delivery, MCH wings, MCTS, Other programs- JSY, JSSK, I-NIPI, PMSMA, PMMVY, NSSK, RKSK etc were discussed interactively

Physical Activity and Health: At the end of the session the learner would be able to understand what physical activity is,

Benefits of physical activity, Types of physical activity and measurement of physical activity, recommended physical activity at different age groups Concept of energy balance and weight loss, Concept of warm up and cool down, Yoga- types, benefits, and proven benefits to humans.

Health and Nutrition of Children: Briefly described on what is health and what is nutrition, what is the important of this certificate course? Nicely discuss on relation between health and nutrition. Discuss very shorty all topics that will be discuss on next lesion plan.

Common childhood respiratory problems: common childhood respiratory problems specially focus on acute respiratory infection, what is pneumonia? What's factors related to it, how will assess a child suffered from ARI including pneumonia, home remedy for it and when to refer to hospital along with nutrition support during illness. Also discuss about childhood asthma and used of different devices that need to treatment

asthma at home. Discuss elaborately the preventives measures air asthma and flu.

Common nutritional problems: Common nutritional problems mainly highlighted on severe acute malnutrition and moderate acute malnutrition are described very nicely; what is malnutrition, how to assess nutritional status, what is protein energy mal nutrition.

Essential new born care: What is essential new born care? Concept behind its need just afterbirth has been discussed. what are the components of essential new born care? Every component was discussed elaborately one by one. To prevent hypothermia of low-birth-weight baby utility of Kangaro Mother Care was discussed. components and benefit of KMC both for mother, baby and health facility were explained. Briefly discuss how to assess new born baby at delivery point

Growth and Development: The meaning of growth and development, common factors responsible growth and development of child, assessment methods of growth and development were discussed. Types of development were explained. Age specific achievement of growth and development of were discuss in detailed. Red flag signs of growth and development have been explained. Shown the different growth chart and discuss its utility and interpretation

Common childhood skin diseases: Common childhood skin diseases, etiological agent of skin diseases. explain the nutrition related skin disorders. Common bacterial, fungal, viral and immunological skin diseases were discussed one by one. some neonatal skin problems that required treatment also discuss. Finally explain the management and the preventive aspects of child hood skin problems.

Different Methods of Assessment of Nutritional Status: Undernourished children suffer from different diseases, particularly various infections. So, assessment of nutritional status is important to know whether the child is healthy or not.

Safe Housing and Environment: Environment is an important determinant of health. Safe environment is very important for the health of women and children. Children may suffer from different diseases due to poor standard of housing and indoor air pollution.

Safe and Wholesome Water and its importance on health: Polluted water is the cause of various water-borne diseases. Children suffer from diarrhea, dysentery, hepatitis and other water-borne diseases, if the water consumed is not safe and wholesome.

Family Planning and its Importance in child health: Small family and proper interval between the births of children is very much necessary for health of women and children. So, knowledge and practice of different methods of family planning by the eligible couple is needed for health and wellbeing of their children.



Date: 10th February - 18th March, 2022

PREAMBLE:

Nearly 40% of India's children below the age of three years are malnourished (underweight) and nearly 26 million are suffering from 'wasting'. At least half of the Indian infant deaths are related to malnutrition, often associated with infectious diseases. Malnutrition impedes motor, sensory, cognitive and social development, so malnourished children will be less likely to benefit from schooling and will consequently have lower incomes as adults. Another end of the spectrum of malnutrition is that of overnutrition leading to increased and early onset of non-communicable/chronic illnesses. 14.4 million Children are obese in India (second to China with 15.3 million in the world). Population based approaches have been the mainstay of research in the field of nutrition for decades. There is a need for India to move from 'Food Security' to 'Nutrition Security'. This requires workforce to be trained in nutrition and health and ready to take up the daunting task of enhancing knowledge and awareness, improving access to nutrition, lifestyle changes and behaviour change communication among the public.

The department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of North Bengal has envisaged this certification course to provide direction to nutrition research and practice in the country and with the objective of contributing towards training future leaders in the field of Public Health Nutrition. Personnel working in private and public sector departments need training and capacity building with the latest research-based approaches and develop skills to lead change.

Concept Note and Brief report

The programme was inaugurated by lighting the lamp by the dignitaries of the dignitaries. The welcome speech was delivered by Dr. Sidhartha Sankar Laha, Associate Professor & Programme Coordinator, Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of North Bengal. He also discussed about the emergency preparedness which refers to the preventative measures taken to reduce the effects of adisaster on our property, family, and life. The goal is to lessen the impact on our life, prepare organizations for extra activity, and create a plan that makes the most of resources and time and reduces the efforts needed to keep the population safe.

Being prepared can save your property and get entire populations back to normal fast be possible if you weren't prepared when the disaster strikes. When you own, break disaster preparedness can save lives. Although it takes some serve your time to plan ahead, it entire family if you plan ahead...." addressed by the Chief Guest Professor (Dr Pronob Ghosh, Registrar, University of North Bengal. The importance of this course was discussed by Prof. Monotosh Bose, Head & Associate Professor, Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of North Bengal. He explained about the various concepts of disaster management. Disaster preparedness or management activities are aime) minimise loss of life and damage in the event of a disaster. Disaster management forces can help by removing people and property

from a threatened location and by facilitating time nd effective rescue, relief and rehabilitation at the place of disaster.

The topic on disaster preparedness was taken by Mr. Subrata Bhattacharaya. In which he elaborated about the preparedness measures to be followed by the country to encounter any disaster events. Disasters are not aberrant phenomena. He said "...You probably don't think about preparing your home for an emergency every day. But, thinking about it at some point is important. That's why we've taken some time during National Emergency Preparedness Month to educate you on ways you can plan ahead to keep yourself, your family, and your property safe. To start, prepare a basic emergency kit for your home. The kit should carry items that will help you survive if you are suddenly displaced or left without electricity and other life resources. ..",

Mr. Jyoti Bikash Dutta presented a very interesting topic on Disaster Preparedness and Disaster Mitigation by displaying the history of occurrences. Floods, droughts, cyclones, earthquakes andlandslides have been recurrent phenomena. About 60% of the landmass is prone to earthquakes of various intensities; over 40 million hectares is prone to floods; about 8% ofthe total area is prone to cyclones and 68% ofthe area issusceptible to drought. In the decade 1990-2000, an average of about 4344 people lost their lives and about 30 million people were affected by disasters everyyear. There are different types of preparedness, such as public health preparedness and local emergency preparedness or snow preparedness, but probably the most developed type is "disaster preparedness", defined by the United Nations as involving "forecasting and taking precautionary measures before an imminent threat."

Mr. Rafikul Islam, First Aid Faculty, said that during a disaster situation there can be a large number of victims. The purp0Se of first aid is to prevent this number from growing and the victims' conditions from worsening, e.g., when helping someone is drowning in a river, the helper should be able to swim and understand the condition of the river current. A first aid kit is a standard item to have when preparing for any type of emergency. It is a kit that's stocked with medical supplies such as antibiotic nnents, antiseptic wipes, aspirin, anti-itch creams, and thermometers. They also include items such as bandages, gauze, tweezers, and gloves.

On day 2, Mr. Jyoti Bikash Dutta started his lecture on The loss of trees and other vegetation can cause climate change, desertification, soil erosion, fewer crops, flooding, increased greenhouse gases in the atmosphere, and a host of problems for indigenous people. In addition to depleting resources for forest-dependent. Communities, deforestation is contributing to an increase in small-scale natural disasters. Well-managed forests and trees can reduce the impacts of disasters. Mr. Dilip Kr. Das, Fire officer has addressed the participants as Many of the life-saving skills that are required in a fire are not regularly practiced.

Brief Information:	

The Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of North Bengal has been pursuing its mission along with philosophy of Lifelong Learning as a part of the creation of learning knowledge society. The Centre for Adult Continuing Education(CACE), University of North Bengal commenced functioning from August 1987 with financial assistant received from the University Grants Commission. Under UGC 10th Plan Guideline the CACE renamed as Department of Adult, Continuing Education, and Extension & Field Outreach (DACEEFO). As per the Eleventh Plan Guideline of UGC and the decision of the North Bengal University Executive Council, the department has become a full-fledged Department with full academic status under University of North Bengal. The nomenclature has been changed as the Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE) in October, 2009. Concept Note and Brief report

Dr. Sidhartha Sankar Laha, Associate Professor, DLLE, NBU -

He acknowledged delegates and participants for joining the programme and mentioned that in the 21st Century, we are living in multi hazard times. He talked on how to use natural resources in a way that doesn't destroy our planet. Planning is crucial for disaster management, and protecting Mother Nature for future generations is our moral obligation. The most damaging natural calamities include cyclones and tsunamis. He also cited several hazards, including violence, environmental degradation, and natural and man-made disasters. According to data presented by him India was ranked 14th in 2019 as most vulnerable country in respect of disaster and for the first-time accepted support from international bodies in this pandemic. He went over a number of terms, such as prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response, rehabilitation, and reconstruction, that are used to comprehend disasters and provided concise definitions with real-world examples. He also provided information on the institutional mechanism for disaster risk management that is now in place in our nation and its operation during disasters.

Dr. Debasish Chattopadhyay, Principal, Tufanganj Mahavidyalaya -

He started his speech with the importance of disaster management awareness. Disaster Management is very important in recent times. It is tackling the hazards that occur before, during and after the disaster. Disaster management is a similar act as consuming medicine for curing a disease. Disaster can also be in any form of epidemic diseases or industrial failures such as Bhopal gas tragedy or the disaster of Fukushima nuclear power

plant, etc. He specifically mentioned that in order to control the disaster our infrastructure should be strong enough. We can prevent the man-made & natural disasters by reducing our never ending non justified reliance on the natural resources and preparedness is very important may it be any kind of calamity. Also mentioned in the event of a disaster, proper preparations are essential for managing the situation. Proper mechanisms help to minimize the effect. Predicting the probability of some types of disasters can help in decreasing the vulnerability of the people. He emphasised the significance of this programme and added that, with the support DLLE, they should be run more frequently.

Nagrul Islam, Associate Professor, CPPBU—

He started his session, a very sensitive yet important topic First aid. First aid refers to the emergency or immediate care you should provide when a person is injured or ill until full medical treatment is available. For minor conditions, first aid care may be enough. For serious problems, first aid care should be continued until more advanced care becomes available. The decision to act appropriately with first aid can mean the difference between life and death. Begin by introducing yourself to the injured or ill person. Explain that you are a first aid provider and are willing to help. The person must give you permission to help them; do not touch them until they agree to be helped. If you encounter a confused person or someone who is critically injured or ill, you can assume that they would want you to help them. This is known as "implied consent. According to him - Consider purchasing a commercially available first aid kit or making your own. Having a kit in your home, your car, and at your place of work is essential to stay prepared.

Pratik Sarkar, Ophiologist--

He discussed what actually Disaster Risk Reduction is? How leverage technology is enhancing the efficiency of DRR efforts? and what NITI Aayog has explained about the water crisis in India? He further focused on various S&T (Science and Technology) which can be used for DRR emphasizing upon - High probability low risk; Low probability low impact. She stretched upon strategies of Sendai Framework and how the use of technology may help us with the idea of sustainable development. He shed light on how efficient planning is needed for keeping a check on climate change. According to the data, 4.5 billion people are lacking safely managed sanitation service, rain water harvesting, cycle run water pumps, water wheel etc. She enlightened on how technology can be used for water conservation and wet line mapping can be used for remote areas as it is cost efficient. Upcoming technologies are Kinetic Football, Kinetic Roads, and Asset Mapping. Specialized areas of civil engineering are earthquake resistant buildings and green sustainable buildings etc. which might help us in having safe infrastructure and also save us valuable energy as well.

To reduce this vulnerability particularly for schools, it is important to have a school Disaster Management Plan. Schools also have many resources and are community nodes. Therefore, a School or College also has responsibility towards its immediate locality, just as the neighboring community is linked to the institution.



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PROPOSAL FOR ORGANIZING INTENSIVE AWARENESS OUTREACH EXTENSION PROGRAMMES ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT DURING THE YEAR 2021-2022

The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension of the University of North Bengal has been organizing different Courses and Programmes on Disaster Management from the year 2015 – 2016. During the current year 2021-2022, the department is also intending to organize the intensive awareness outreach extension programmes on Disaster Management if the University authority approves the same. It is also proposed that Dr. Sidhartha Sankar Laha, Associate Professor will act as Course Coordinator while the Head of the Department will be the overall mentor of the programmes. The proposed programmes will be as follows:

Aims and Objectives:

Disaster management is the discipline of dealing with and avoiding menaces. It is a discipline that involves preparing for disaster before it happens, disaster reaction as well as supporting, and rejuvenating society after disasters have occurred. It is a continuous process by which all individuals, groups and communities manage hazards in an effort to circumvent or recuperate the impact of disasters resulting from the hazards. The aim of emergency planning is to ensure that the safety of the students and the staff is maintained during an emergency. The emergency management plan is a means by which this can be achieved. The main focus of the intensive awareness outreach programmes on Disaster Management:

- How to identify the hazards in the school/ college;
- How to manage the hazards;
- How to prepare the school community for any emergency response;
- How to mitigate the effects through planning and effective response;
- To create awareness and build the capacity of school community;
- To promote partnership among various stakeholders.

The School or college is a densely populated place and has small children that are one of the most vulnerable groups in the society. To reduce this vulnerability particularly for schools, it is important to have a school Disaster Management Plan. Schools also have many resources and are community nodes. Therefore, a School or College also has responsibility towards its immediate locality, just as the neighboring community is linked to the institution.



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Plan of the Department:

Due to shortage of time and Covid protocol, the Departmental Committee decided in the meeting was held on 16.11.2021 that awareness outreach extension programmes on Disaster Management will continue in the north Bengal districts – Dakshin Dinajpur (One School), Cooch Bihar (one College) and Jalpaiguri (One School or College) and one Workshop on Disaster Management for selected participant at North Bengal University.

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


NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEMEUNIT V




3. Debate completion on Russia – Ukraine War
