International Women's Day

The United Nations Charter, 1945, was the first international agreement to embrace the ideal of gender equality. In the International Women's Year, 1975, United Nations commemorated the first official International Women's Day on 8th March. In December 1977, UN General Assembly passed a resolution that declared one day of the calendar year be observed as United Nations Day for Women's Rights and International Peace, this could fall on any day of the year in line with historical and national traditions.

International Women's Day evolved from the efforts of labour organizations across North America and Europe at the beginning of twentieth century. The Social Party of America helped establish the inaugural National Women's Day on February 28, 1909 in commemoration of garment workers' protests in New York City on 8th March 1857. Women in Russia organized and demonstrated under the slogan "Bread and Peace" on the last Sunday in February 1917. This day also falls on 8th March in Georgian Calendar.
