2. PROFILE OF THE CENTRE

2.1. OBJECTIVES:-

Briefly, the purpose behind the establishment of the Centre for Women's Studies at the University of North Bengal was two-fold, namely

- a. To articulate the situations of women in general and their developmental needs through academic research, teaching programmes with an ultimate policy focus;
- b. To fulfill critical gender needs and to build self-awareness and self-confidence among women in the region, through grass root empowerment activities that would encourage their articulate participation in the institutions of governance.

2.2 FULFILLMENT:-

Since its establishment in 2000, programmes undertaken at CWS have sought to reach out to women of all sections from the North Bengal districts and Sikkim, in order to fulfill these objectives. The core activities undertaken by CWS in framing a regional research programme in Women's Studies are an integral part of the CWS Action Plan. CWS also provides critical

community support services, and networks with Government institutions, women's organizations and NGOs in order to generate Community Action for the fulfillment of regional women's needs.

Keeping the basic objectives in view, the Centre for Women's Studies has endeavored to coordinate multidisciplinary activities that can synergies the expertise into a definite core for Women's Studies pertaining to the North Bengal region. The Centre has also undertaken programmes to extend research and training skills of individual scholars and departments, within and without the University system. Projects and programmes undertaken by the Centre have sought to formulate developmental policies for the betterment and empowerment of the women of this region. To realize and attain the above, the Centre has established an interface of technical, academic and administrative skills throughout the region. Various departments at the University have already established programmes in Women's Studies with a significant research component in addition to their teaching content. The Centre has endeavored to consolidate and strengthen these studies and capabilities under its umbrella.

However, since 2009 during XIth Plan, the Centre has started **Refresher Course on Women's Studies** for University and College teachers, in collaboration with UGC Human Resource Development Centre of the University.

Till date the Centre has successfully completed ten (10) Refresher Courses. University / College teachers from all over the country has been participated in the course.

Further, to generate academic interest amongst the young generation towards Women's Studies and make them aware to gender issues the Centre has started short term **Certificate Courses** on various women's issues along with its regular activities like Research works, Publications, Seminar, Workshop, Sensitization and Awareness programmes on gender issues at various level including the grass root women. The project work initiated at the Centre aids the formulation of gender sensitive development policies and programme for the upliftment and empowerment of women in the region.

However, as per the decision taken at the Advisory Committee Meeting under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, University of North Bengal, it has been decided that the Centre will start **Short Term Course on Women's Studies for College** / **University Teachers** from this year. Accordingly it has been implemented from the year 2018-19.

3.0 DETAILS OF THE ACTIVITES:-

3.1 TEACHING COURSES

Keeping in mind the criteria laid down by UGC as per XIIth Plan guideline where UGC encourage the teaching courses to build strong academic base institutionally for Women's Studies, the Centre has started Refresher Courses on Women's Studies and Short term Certificate Courses on Women's Issues, Research Methodology for Gender Studies, Geo informatics & Computer application during XIIth Plan Period.

In order to disseminate the knowledge as well as to create academic interest on **Women's Studies**, the Centre have taken few new initiative, by means of organizing various kinds of collaborative programme with different institute including government departments

The Centre has organized the following teaching courses in the year 2018-19 (till February, 2019).

A. ORIENTATION PROGRAMME (05 DAYS)

The Centre for Women's Studies, University of North Bengal has organized the Orientation Programme on Combating Violence Against Women and Girls for College/ University Teachers from August 27-31, 2018, in collaboration with National Institute Of Public Cooperation and Child Development Regional Centre, Jawahar Nagar, Guwahati, Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India. Teachers from various Colleges and Universities of entire West Bengal, Sikkim, Assam were attended the course.



Orientation Programme on Combating Violence against Women and Girls
August 27-31, 2018

Aims and Objectives of the Course

Violence against women is a manifestation of historically unequal power relations between men and women, which have led to domination over and discrimination against women by men and to the prevention of the full advancement of women, and that violence against women is one of the crucial social mechanisms by which women are forced into a subordinate position compared with men". Violence against women (VAW) is a global problem that exterminates tortures and hurts them physically, psychologically, sexually and economically every year. It is one of the most pervasive forms of human rights violation, denying women and girls' equality, security, dignity, self-worth, and their right to enjoy fundamental rights. VAW violates several recognized human rights such as the right to life, freedom from torture, equal protection before the law, liberty and security of person, the highest attainable standards of physical and mental health, and the right to be heard. It negatively affects women's general wellbeing and prevents them from fully participating as equal partners in national development. Violence not only has negative consequences for women and girls but also their families, community and the country at large.

To effectively deal with the problem of violence against women, and to bridge the gap between public and private sphere, there have been numerous governmental and non- governmental interventions. The government is working towards strengthening the existing legislations through review and amendments, wherever required, and developing institutional mechanisms. It is felt that, sensitizing the college teachers would also act as a preventive strategy for combating violence against women. Keeping the above in view, a five days "Orientation Programme on Combating Violence Against Women and Girls for College/ University Teachers, August 27-31, 2018 is being organised at North Bengal University, Darjeeling, West Bengal in collaboration with NIPCCD.

The main objectives of the training are:

- 1. To develop clear perspective among participants about gender based violence;
- 2. To provide insight on the policies, existing support services and legal safeguards for women and girls to curb the problem;
- 3. To build capacities to provide services to survivors of violence including counselling, livelihood and rehabilitation; and to evolve strategies for combating violence against women and children

The inaugural programme of the course was started at 10.30 am, on 27th August,2018 at Room No 109,Humanities Building, NBU. Dr. Beethika Moni Dutta, Project Officer, Centre for Women's Studies has started the inaugural programme by welcoming the guests, participants and students. The programme was started with an inaugural song presented by the students of the University. Dr. D K Sarkar, Registrar, NBU jointly with Prof. Soumitra Dey, Director, IQAC, NBU inaugurate the ceremony by lighting the lamp. Prof. Debika Saha, Director, CWS, Ms. K. Sunita Sheshadri, Assistant Director, NIPCCD, Guwahati along with Dr. Beethika Moni Dutta, Project Officer, Centre for Women's Studies also join them.

Prof. Debika Saha, Director, CWS, deliver her welcome speech. She welcome all the dignitaries from the University of North Bengal as well as from NIPCCD, Guwahati, participants from various colleges and universities of West Bengal, Sikkim for choosing the Institute to attend the

She spoke briefly about the activities of the Centre and importance of organizing such kind of programme. Ms. K. Sunita Sheshadri, Assistant Director, NIPCCD introduce the theme of the programme and discuss about the objectives. She elaborately explain the activities of the institute and said that such kind of joint programme is very effective for both the institute.

Professor Soumitra Dey, in his inaugural speech express his best wishes to the organizers and welcome this joint effort of both the Centre and NIPCCD and also mention that such kind of programme will be very beneficial for the participants. He also pointed out the fact that the theme of the programme is very much relevant to the present scenario of our society as well as our day to day life. Dr. D K Sarkar, Registrar, University of North Bengal, the Chief Guest of the inaugural ceremony deliver his speech with a thanks to the organizers for organizing such kind of programme which is need of the hour. He spoke about the existing gender stereotype as well as patriarchal mindset in our society. Such kind of programmes are very much essential to sensitize and create awareness about gender discrimination among the people of our society.

The programme was ended with the vote of thanks proposed by Dr Beethika Moni Dutta, K. Sunita Sheshadri, Assistant Director, NIPCCD, Guwahati jointly with Dr. Beethika Moni Dutta, Project Officer, Centre for Women's Studies, NBU, coordinate the course. During five days, different aspects of the Violence Against Women and how to combat it including legal provisions and government schemes has been discussed. Dr. D. K. Saikia, Regional Director, NIPCCD, Professor Debika Saha, Director, CWS, K. Sunita Sheshadri, Assistant Director, NIPCCD, Dr. Beethika Moni Dutta, CWS and faculties from various university departments along with government officials deliver lectures in the course. The Centre also arranged a field visit for the participants and brought them to two (02) NGO's working on issues like trafficking, child marriage, dowry and skill development of Women. This visit help the participants to know the ground realities of violence against women taking place in our society and how women are victimized in their day to day life. The Chairperson of the NGO explain how it works by sharing their field experience and also explain few case studies. Thus, the visit was very effective for the participants to understand the root causes lying behind the problem and find out the strategies to combat the same.

In the valedictory session, Certificate has been distributed to the participants. Dr. D. K. Sarkar, Registrar, NBU and Prof. Debabrata Mitra, professor, department of Commerce and Director, UGC, HRDC, NBU were present in the valedictory programme. (Encl- I)

Workshop on Gender Awareness and Recent Trends
September 12-13, 2018

Aims and Objectives of the Workshop

Gender Awareness is an understanding that there are socially determined differences between women and men based on learned behavior, which affects access to and control over resources. This awareness needs to be applied through gender analysis into projects, programs and policies.

Gender is a complex variable in social, cultural, religious, economic and political contexts and is different in across time, space and communities. The question of gender needs theoretical clarity. Gender is not a rigid or reified analytic category imposed on human experience, but a fluid one whose meaning emerges in specific social contexts as it is created and recreated through human actions. Through the workshop the basic concepts of Gender, recent development in gender studies and their implications for the practice of social sciences in India will be discussed. The issues related to all forms of violence against women in all spheres of life will also be addressed through this deliberation. The different methodological and theoretical approaches to gender and its relevance to interdisciplinary subjects will also be highlighted.

- * Gender awareness, gender analysis and gender methodology.
- * Explore the nature of gender, developing a deeper sense of its nature, role, and manifestation in society.
- * Interpersonal development, relationship building and reflection.
- * To address the issues related to violence against women.

About the Seminar theme and Subthemes-

Concept Note

In recent years with the emergence of a set of theoretical, cultural and political factors, the concepts of gender, womanhood and identity, based on territorial / terrestrial / textual imagination, have been critically examined. This is a world-wide phenomenon that impacts on our understanding of what has been regarded as Feminist Enquiry of knowledge and society.

The image of traditional 'mainstream' Indian woman is the consequence of the patriarchal domination, rendering 'ideal' Indian women as agents of patriarchy and creating constraints in

their attempts to evolve as liberated women of agencies. The stereotyped image has been prescribed by only cherry picking from the 'Great Tradition' that is full of women who were glorified only to be beguiled and utilized. The traditions that are tagged as 'Little' or even the belittled women icons of the 'Great Tradition' need to be revisited to convey a holistic picture of the counter-cultures of Indian Women as ones who have made significant contributions and raised their voices in order to assert their rights. In times like ours when any deviation from the codified 'mainstream' feminine morality is perceived as Western or non-Indian, the plethora of janajati cultures of India as well as the diverse folk traditions of India need to be revisited in order to counter-narrate the dissident femininity as manifested through the alternative treatment of womanhood in these counter-cultures. Moreover, the resistance offered by the women of sexual minority, feminist media and gender activists has to be endorsed in order to fight against the schemas that have been targeted to turn women into mere docile bodies.

In this seminar we want to ask the following questions: How can the alternative models to counter the 'mainstream' morality associated with women be traced by revisiting Subcultures of Feminist Resistance in India? What are the contributions of women in the arena of indigenous knowledge? How do folk traditions offer models of dissidence against taboos and restrictions imposed on women? Is there a genealogy of Indian feminist theology based on the women mystics' contemplation on feminine desire, experience and transcendence? What are the ways by which one can affirm that India has always been inclusive in its attitude towards women of nonconformist sexuality and what are the provisions that one need to provide them in the post Supreme Court verdict related to article 377 of Indian Constitution? What portrayals of empowered women can one come across in contemporary and historical representation of women?

Subthemes

Indian Women and Indignity: Women and indigenous knowledge; Alternative images of Ethnic women in folklore; Indigenous Feminism in Indian Context

Women and Indian Folk traditions: Ethno music, Folkdance, Folk celebrations in rural India as modes of women's empowerment; Feminist Folklores

Indian Feminist Theology: Reconsidering the perspectives of the women Indian mystics and tracing their deviances from the male counterpart.

Indian Women and nonconformist desire and sexuality: The narratives and representations of the non hetero-normative women; women stepping into the 'tabooed' zones and challenging the biased prohibitions of desires and conducts.

Subcultures of Feminist Resistance in India: Re-visiting history, myth, political resistance, educational and socio-cultural reforms, economic enterprises; women and science; women dissenters in Indian intellectual traditions

Representing the Counter-cultures of Indian women: Portrayal of the dissident women in literature, cinema, forms of art and architecture, advertisements, fashion, photography etc.; rewriting of myths and unrecorded history to voice resistance, personal narratives of protest; feminist activism through social media

Indian women and contested geographies: Atypical Women and Public Space; women and their narrative histories related to old-age homes, camps, sanitariums, prisons, red light areas, bars etc. (Encl-IV)
