9. Achievements of the Department

The Department of Philosophy is one of the most accomplished places of learning among the different departments of North Bengal University and a centre for excellence among Philosophy departments in India. Our achievements may be highlighted as follows:

Special Assistance Programme: We were among the first few departments at NBU to have been awarded the UGC-SAP in 2002. We have been successfully running the programme since then. Our good work has been acknowledged by the UGC and we have been rewarded through extension of the SAP from DRS-I to DRS II and now DRS III. Moreover, in DRS III we have received a grant of Rs. 1.20 crore, one of the highest funding given to any Arts and Humanities department under SAP in India.

Publications: During the period 2006-16 we have published sixteen books highlighting the relation of language with morality, ontology, value, culture, aesthetics, thought, phenomenology, truth, grammar, interpretation, and reality. Nine books are in press at different stages. One of the tasks under this project was to translate Sanskrit texts into regional languages. We have four books which are based on the translation or reinterpretation of Sanskrit texts written in a regional language i.e., Bengali after following the UGC's guideline to publish a few Sanskrit texts interpreted in regional languages. We believe that our work on various aspects of language, on which a total of thirty books have been published or are in press, has opened a vista in research in the field of Philosophy of Language.

Epoch making Thinkers: Our department has also been awarded two Centres of study namely, Centre of Buddhist Studies and Centre of Ambedkar Studies approved by UGC under a scheme to open study centres commemorating Epoch Making Thinkers of India. These centres focus on various interdisciplinary aspects of Buddhism and Ambedkar's thought and their relevance to contemporary Indian Society and Culture. Distinguished scholars from different parts of India and abroad have visited the center. Two books entitled: *'Language and Truth in Buddhism'* and *'Socio-Political Philosophy of Ambedkar'* have been published.

Faculty achievements: All the faculty members have visited several Indian Universities and Colleges to attend seminars and given special invited lectures. Those who have also gone abroad for academic engagement are

- Dr. Anirban Mukherjee went to University of Reading for PhD with Felix Scholarship. He also attended seminars in University of Utrecht, University of Geneva, and Manchester University.
