Student Study support:

- 1. Computer with internet connection exclusively for student use.
- 2. Remedial Coaching for SC/ST students
- 3. Coaching for SC/ST students for NET / SLET exam.
- 4. Personal guidance in preparing seminar papers.
- 5. Open-door policy for better facultystudent interaction. Faculty members encourage students to freely approach them with academic issues.

- 6. Students are encouraged to be present and participate at seminars and external faculty visits. Visitors to the department are often impressed by the lively participation of the students and share appreciative comments.
- 7. The department also organizes film screenings at regular intervals which become points of discussion for the following days, often leading to interesting questions in the classroom.

Student progression:

- 1. Majority of the students do well in the examinations, a few securing 60% marks and above. The success rate is 99% and dropout rate is a low 1%.
- 2. Many of the PG students take on a career in research with scholarships from funding bodies such as UGC and ICPR. Our students have been awarded UGC-NET JRF, ICPR JRF, Vivekananda single girl child Scholarship, and Rajiv Gandhi Scholarship for SC/ST students.
- 3. Many students (around 86) are successful in getting teaching jobs in schools through West Bengal School Service Commission and West Bengal Public Service commission, in Colleges (around 65) through West Bengal College Service Commission and West Bengal Public Service Commission, and in Universities (around 8) through direct recruitment process. Some also move on to opportunities in other states of India and abroad.
- 4. Some students join Govt. offices after qualifying in the competitive examinations, some work with NGOs, and a few start businesses.

Student Participation and Activities

Students are encouraged to participate in the seminars organized in the Department. They also organize several cultural events and field trips.
