Concept Note

There is therefore, a strong need to revisit the Indian National Movement particularly the revolutionary nationalist movement.It is significant to locate and narrate the faded memories of the national movement against the foreign rule that would serve as a medium of source of inspiration and encouragement for the coming generations.

Keeping in view to discover, recognize the revolutionary nationalist movement of Bengal and the neighbouring regions the seminar wants to emphasize on the revolutionary nationalist leaders, participants and activities of Bengal and the near by areas of the Assam and North Eastern region. It equally wants to focus on the national movement in the northern part of Bengal and the participation of the communities namely the Rajbansis, Nepalis, and others in it. There were protests and resistance by the tea plantation workers mostly the Oraons, Mundas, Santals against the British rule and the peasants against the oppression of the colonial taxes. Furthermore, the involvement of the people of North Bengal, their sacrifices and contribution have not been recorded well. The seminar looks forward to remember and highlight the activities and sacrifices of the unsung heroes of the region.

- i. Format: Submissions are to be made in MS-Word Format only.
- ii. The Full Paper should only have the following:
- a. Title of the Research
- b. Abstract
- c. Author(s) Full Name.
- d. Institutional Affiliation, with full address of the institution.
- e. Email Id
- f. Mobile Number
- g. Language: English and Bengali.
- iii. Formatting: The documents must be styled as follows:
- a. Page Layout: Orientation: Portrait, Margin: 1 inch (2.54 cm) from all sides
- b. Font:Times New Roman(English); Amar Bangla(Bengali)
- c. Font Size: 12
- d. Paragraph Line Spacing: 1.5 Line Spacing, No space before or after paragraphs.
- iv. Referencing: MLA style
- v. Word Count: The word limit for full paper submission including abstract and references should be between 2500 to 3000 words.

Papers will only be accepted if they have not been copyrighted, published, presented, or accepted for presentation at any other academic seminars and are not currently under review for presentation/publication. A declaration to this effect will be sought from authors whose research work has been accepted for the Conference.
